Psychic sense

Clifton man sees a lot happening in 2000, including skeletons flying from Marge's closet

Michael Dennis, who grew up near Louisville, says he was 13 when he started talking to angels and spirit guides in his back yard. After meeting men like the Amazing Kreskin in 1979, Dennis became convinced of his psychic powers.

Dennis studied metaphysics for several years before giving up teaching in 1991 to concentrate on his psychic and writing career.

Dennis describes himself as being "entertaining" rather than psy-
